



2015 Earl Corkett Regatta SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

March 29

Organizing Authority: Newport Harbor Yacht Club

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined by the *Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2. Harbor 20 Class Association and Fleet 1 Bylaws, Rules and Specifications will apply to the Harbor 20 Fleets.
- 1.3. Breaches of instructions which are annotated [NP] will not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes rule 60.1(a). If the jury concludes that a boat has broken one of these rules, or rule 55, it may impose a penalty other than disqualification. In these cases, the discretionary penalty, if less than disqualification, will be represented by the scoring abbreviation "DPI". The penalty imposed by the jury in such case constitutes the "other penalty" in the first sentence of rule 64.1.
- 1.4. For the Harbor 20 Fleets only, RRS 44.2 is changed so that only one tack and one gybe are required.
- 1.5. US Sailing prescription RRS 60, 63.2 and 63.4 are deleted.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in the main hallway at Newport Harbor Yacht Club (NHYC) as well as on the online notice board which is accessible at www.nhyc.org.

3. CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change in the sailing instructions will be posted on the official notice board no later than thirty (30) minutes before it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be made by 2000h on the day before it is to take place.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1. Signals made ashore will be displayed from the signal mast located at the top of the main dock gangway.
- 4.2. When flown ashore, Code flag "AP", Answering Pennant, with two horns (one horn when lowered) means, "Racing is postponed: do not leave the harbor. The time of the warning signal will be posted before the lowering of 'AP'." This changes RRS Race Signals, AP.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

The scheduled time of the first warning signal for the first race is 1300.

6. RACING AREA

Racing will take place in the harbor north of NHYC.

7. COURSES

- 7.1. The diagrams in Addendum A - Course Descriptions show the possible courses to be sailed.
- 7.2. No later than the warning signal, the race committee (RC) signal boat will display the course to be sailed.
- 7.3. The letter "G" displayed with any course description will denote that a gate will replace Mark 3.
When there is a leeward gate, boats shall sail between the gate marks from the direction of the previous mark and round either gate mark.
- 7.4. All marks are to be left to port unless otherwise indicated.

8. MARKS

8.1. The marks will be as follows:

MARK	DESCRIPTION
1, 2, 3 (3s, 3p)	GREEN inflatable shape
O	ORANGE inflatable ball
Start, Finish	ORANGE inflatable cylinder

8.2. The starting/finishing line marks are not marks of the course except when starting or finishing.

9. AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS

[NP] Moored boats and their mooring balls and lines shall not be touched in any way.

10. THE START/FINISH

10.1. All races will be started using RRS US Sailing Prescription Appendix S.

10.2. The start and finish line will be between the course side of an orange staff on an R/C boat and the course side of a nearby start or finish mark. Competitors are advised to pay particular attention to Addendum A for the location of the finish line.

11. CHANGE OF COURSE AFTER THE START

To change the position of the next mark, the RC will move the original mark to a new position. The change will be signaled before the first boat has begun the leg. At the time of the signal, the new mark need not be in position. Any subsequent mark to be rounded after the new mark may be relocated to maintain original course configuration without a signal.

12. TIME LIMIT

12.1. The time limit for the first boat to finish will be one (1) hour.

12.2. A boat that fails to finish within fifteen (15) minutes after the first boat in her class sails the course and finishes will be scored Time Limit Expired ("TLE") without a hearing. In such case, the R/C may terminate the race and score the boat points equal to the number of boats finishing plus two (2). This changes RRS 35, A4, A5, and A11.

13. PROTESTS

13.1. Protest must be submitted in writing, on forms available at the Protest Desk, located in the Race Office of NYHC. Protests shall be delivered there within the protest time limit.

13.2. Protests must be delivered within thirty (30) minutes of the RC signal boat docking time. The protest time limit will be posted on the Official Notice Board. The same protest time limit applies to all protests by the RC and jury about incidents they observe in the racing area and to request for redress. This changes RRS 61.3 and 62.2.

13.3. The protest committee will hear protests as soon as possible and in the order it determines. The hearing schedule will be posted on the notice board and at the protest desk no later than fifteen (15) minutes after the close of protest time. This posting will constitute the notification required by RRS 63.2.

13.4. It is the sole responsibility of each boat involved to be ready and have witnesses available when the hearing is called.

13.5. If the RC posts a list of boats scored OCS, ZFP, or BFD on the official notice board before the protest time limit, a request for redress based on such a posted score shall be made no later than sixty (60) minutes after the protest time limit. This changes the first sentence of RRS 62.2.

14. SCORING

14.1. Two (2) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

14.2. When five (5) or fewer races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

15. TROPHIES

Trophies will be awarded to class winners, based on the number of entries, on Sunday, March 29 as soon as possible after the last race.
